We are surrounded with geopolitical locations.

The human mammal range on planet Earth is set within the confines of state power. Everyone is accountable to some nation and all nations compete for dominion. "World" tends to mean no more than a relative standing in this competition - "1st, 2nd or 3rd World."

But we all know there is more to our place within the allliving-whole than being a Canadian in the 1st, a Pole in the 2nd or a Zambian in the 3rd World. And there are common localwhole concerns which cannot be resolved through the machinations of state power.

Our identity as planetarians is overdue.

This is a review of some groups recognized by the United Nations as non-governmental organizations. All are involved in "the environment" and sent representatives to UN Conferences on the Human Environment held in 1972. Most of them use "international or "world" in their titles. They are allegedly non-political and undertake activities or projects which might be seen as having a basis in planet concerns.

Each organization responded to an inquiry for background information, objectives, current operations, and "areas of environmental concern which require a 'planetary' perspective -

a perspective inclusive of every human on the planet or the entire biosphere."

World Assembly of Youth's first reply from their New York representative came under the letterhead of The Dreyfus Corporation, a mutual funds investment firm, referring the inquiry to WAY headquarters in Brussels. They stated involvement with one "global" problem - population in 20 under-developed countries.

Addressing UN non-governmental representatives to the Human Environment Conference on "the patience of the poor," Barbara Ward warned that "on the planetary level...unless we deal with the substance of human life in a natural environment which supports the dignity of human beings...the condition of the people will end in an explosion equal to that of the 1840's."

An investment corporation executive is troubled by 3rd World population and Lady Jackson (Barbara Ward's title) fears rebellion. Aren't these geopolitical symptoms?

"Population Control" (a phrase peculiar to groups with human numbers as a central concern), "Consumers," "Environment Issues," "Industry," "Ethics" and "Conservation/'Animals'" - categories for the groups reviewed - aren't they new geopolitical containments for our planetary aspirations?

World Federation for the Protection of Animals is predominately a 1st World group, more European than American, and committed more to representing an ethical position than working with animals.

Human domination of the planet is accepted explicitly, but the idea of continuous nature reserve belts with disregard for national "territory" is a genuinely planetary vision.

lst, 2nd and 3rd World nations are represented and participate on the executive board, but the commissions are slanted toward "Western" expertise.

IUCN is an authority on questions of biospheric management. Special research projects employ recognized specialists and usually involve unique data. National governments and the UN make decisions about conservation, resources, environment, and even parks with reference to IUCN data and criterion. Although oriented toward whole ecological systems rather than industrial production, these criterion project "Western" scientific and cultural values onto large areas of

the planet.
